PROPOSED MODALITIES FOR THE TAKE-OFF OF SPECIAL POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN EDUCATION PROGRAMME FOR HIGHER EDUCATION TEACHERS

The Senate of University of Uyo at its 98th meeting held on 25th November, 2015 approved the mounting of the Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education Programme for Higher Education Teachers.

As a follow-up to the approval, the Board of Institute of Education at its meeting held on Wednesday, June 22, 2016 considered and recommended the following modalities for the take-off of the Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education Programme for Higher Education Teachers:

1. The Programme should commence during the 2016/2017 end of session Long

Vacation period.

- 2. Adequate publicity/advertisement for admission should be made in both national and local newspapers for the information of the prospective students.
- 3. Course should be assigned to lecturers soonest so that they would be able to prepare all their lectures/materials in soft copies ahead of the commencement of the programme.
- 4. As much as possible all the courses should be team taught.
- 5. Lecture time-table: Lectures should be scheduled to hold only on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesday and Thursdays between 2.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. each day.
- 6. One large lecture hall should be dedicated for the programme.
- 7. Maximum of two courses should be taught in any of the days scheduled for lecture.
- 8. Since lecturers are to prepare their lectures in soft copies, there is need for a functional interactive board to be provided in the lecture hall when there will be a non-interrupted power supply.

SPECIAL POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN EDUCATION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION TEACHERS

1.0 **Introduction**

The Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) programme is based on the Benchmark statements and minimum Academic Standards for Postgraduate Programmes in Education in Nigerian Universities as required by the National Universities Commission (NUC) and the Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN). This special Postgraduate Diploma in Education (SPGDE) programme is adapted from the regular PGDE programme and is designed to afford the non-professional teachers in higher institutions the opportunity to acquire requisite knowledge and skills to improve on their teaching performance. In a number of occasions, the need for teachers in higher institutions of learning to be professionals in teaching has been noted and discussed in the Senate of the University. In those instances, the possibility of mounting professional teaching programmes for lecturers who are not professional teachers were mooted.

1.1 Mission of the Programme

The mission of the Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education Programme is to equip higher education lecturers with the relevant professional knowledge, skills and attitudes to function more effectively as teachers.

1.2 Philosophy of the Programme

The philosophy of the programme is anchored on the recent trend in Universities and other higher institutions across the world in which efforts are being made to incorporate teacher training into academic staff development in order to ensure quality teaching and learning aimed at meeting the society's developmental challenges.

1.3 Aims and Objectives

The Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education programme is concerned with both theoretical and practical aspects of teaching and learning. Studies in the programme address the philosophical bases of educational practice, the diverse human settings within which teaching and learning occur, the process and content of teaching, the definition of teacher's role and profession as well as the education of teachers. It therefore aims at initiating educators who are not professionally trained in teaching into the complex but scientifically guided activities of teaching.

Specifically, the Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education Programme is designed to achieve the following objectives:-

- 1. To develop the professional knowledge of university teachers as educators.
- 2. To enhance the paedagogical competence of educators in various areas of academic specialization.
- 3. To help educators develop the requisite attitudes, skills and values that promotes learning and societal development.
- 4. To equip higher education teachers with the skills of preparing course structure, outlines and instructional plans.
- 5. To enable higher education teachers develop the skills of evaluation and the use of evaluation to promote effective learning.
- 6. To enable the higher education teachers acquire the knowledge and skills of appropriate classroom management for effective learning.

2.0 Admission Requirements

- The programme is open to all members of the academic staff of the University and other higher institutions who have no professional teaching qualification irrespective of the degrees obtained.
- 2. It should be noted that the minimum professional qualification for teaching in Nigeria is the Nigeria Certificate in Education

(NCE). So academic staff who have not obtained this minimum professional qualification are required and eligible to undertake the special PGDE programme, except those who had acquired at least Grade II Teachers Certificate earlier.

3.0 Academic Regulations

3.1 **Duration of the Programme**

The programme shall be intensive and shall run for a minimum of two slots or a maximum of four slots of three months duration per slot. It is proposed that the programme should be run during semester breaks.

3.2 Requirements for Graduation

The candidates shall fulfill the following conditions to be awarded the Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education:

3.3 Course Delivery and Evaluation

- (a) Course delivery shall be more of inquiry, group work, seminars, computer-assisted instruction, and less expository
- (b) Continuous Assessment and written examination shall be given for every course.
- (c) Continuous assessment shall be done through tests, term papers, tutorial exercises, and take-home assignments.
- (d) Each course shall be taught and examined at the end of the slot in which it is offered.
- (e) The minimum pass mark in any course shall be 50%, which is graded "C".

3.4 Presentation of Examination Result

Results shall be subject to internal moderation at Board of Institute level before presentation to the Postgraduate School Board for consideration and final presentation to the University Senate for approval.

3.5 Certification

Certification shall take place following successful completion of programme requirements. The class of Diploma shall be determined by the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned at the end of the programme for all Postgraduate Diplomas in Education as shown in the Table below:

4.0 THE CURRICULUM

The Special Postgraduate Diploma in Education Programme for University of Uyo teachers shall consist principally:

- (a) Coursework credited with a total of 22 credit hours
- (b) Teaching practice lasting 4 weeks where lecturers will be supervised during their normal teaching contacts.
- (c) Seminar report in a relevant area related to education.

4.2 **DESCRIPTION OF THE SPDE COURSES**

SPDE 711: Foundations of Education (4CH)

A study of Western educational practices, indigenous education and formal education in Nigeria under colonial governance. Post-independence educational policies and practices. The National Policy on Education – origin, reviews and educational practices. Provisions of the Teachers Registration Council of Nigeria (TRCN) Act 31 of 1993 and professionalization of teaching.

Teachers' Code of Conduct, challenges of the profession. Theories of social interaction and social change and their relevance to educational theory and practice. Socialization and social problems in the school. The role of the teacher in the management of social problems. Contributions of philosophy to education. Selected philosophical thoughts and their influence on education.

SPDE 712: Psychology of Learning (3CH)

Fundamental concepts of learning. Study of major theories of learning and their implications for teaching and learning. Theories and principles of human growth and development. Adolescence psychology. Guidance and Counselling – concepts, scope and goals, implications for learning.

SPDE 713: Curriculum and Instruction (3CH)

Concepts of Curriculum and Instruction. Components of the curriculum. Curriculum Planning and development. Principles of effective teaching and learning. Instructional planning, units of instruction and lesson plans. Content development and implementation in higher education. Different methods of teaching. Instructional resources. Classroom management. Curriculum reforms and agents in Nigeria.

SPDE 714: Measurement and Evaluation (3CH)

Concepts and nature of tests, measurement, assessment and evaluation. Psychometric properties of test – validity, reliability, usability, etc. Types of tests and guidelines for test construction, test administration, scoring and interpretation of grades. Evaluation, standardization strategies – means, normal curve, standard deviation, table of specification and transformation of scores. Ethics of measurement and evaluation. Continuous Assessment characteristics and challenges. Examination bodies in Nigeria and their roles.

SPDE 715: Special Area Methods (3CH)

Learners shall be exposed to techniques of teaching different subjects using different methods appropriate to their area of specialization. Strategies for lesson and unit planning in higher education. Production, Utilization and evaluation of instructional resources; assessment; instructional problems and prospects in areas of specialization.

SPDE 721: Educational Technology (4CH)

Educational technology as an educational innovation. Instructional Design, process and components. Various media in Education Broadcast, photography and graphics library and other learning resources. Selecting media for instructional utilization, techniques and procedures. Improvisation using of local resources and materials. Evaluating instructional resources.

SPDE 722: ICT for Higher Education (4CH)

Use of computer in Education. Software Packages for teaching, learning and evaluation. Theory and practice of educational data management. Use of MS word, PPT in teaching and learning and Excel in educational data management. Use of Internet in teaching and learning; blogging, skype, etc.

SPDE 723: Teaching Practice (4CH)

This course provides the participants opportunity to practicalise their knowledge and classroom management skills in their subject areas.

SPDE 724: Project/Seminar (4CH)

Participants will be expected to undertake a research project on any of the areas of the programme and present same as seminar.
